**Remarks**

- This curriculum summary was formulated based on the University Law and the Academic Regulations of Hsing Wu University and it was reviewed and passed by the School Curriculum Committee on September 20th, 2023.
- This department's curriculum design is a four-year program. Students in this department must pass 128 credits in total in order to meet the graduation requirements, including the completion of 28 credits of required courses and 4 selective courses on General Education, and the completion of 32 credits and 64 credits of required professional courses.
- According to the required subjects listed in this summary, students must take academic semester or yearly courses arranged by the school authorities. Assessing the circumstances, the department will "alternatively offer" courses for students to study. Students' graduation credits will be validated only when they pass the 1st and 2nd semester courses.
- In addition to taking the required professional courses for the module certificate of this department, students also need to take elective courses of more than 10 credits (including) in the same module.
- General Education: students must complete 14 credits of "Vocational General Education" courses, at least 2 credits of "Liberal Arts Education" courses and at least 4 credits of "Modern Civic Literacy" courses, and at least 8 credits of "Health Management" courses. From each category, students can choose to take 4 credits of elective courses and the grand total of credits completed by students should be 32 credits. Please refer to the curriculum summary made by the General Education Center for details of category classification.
- The credits taken by students who have completed the professional elective subjects but studied the same courses will be invalidated to avoid double counting.
- Students must acquire professional certificates according to the policies made by the department.
- Internship Guidelines: during the study period, internship courses take by students each semester must not exceed 9 credits. And the total internship credits must not exceed 18 credits.
- As to the fourth year courses in this curriculum summary, senior class students must take "Work-place Ethics" for the 1st semester and "Business Trends" for the 2nd semester except those students who choose to attend overseas internship programs.
- @this double circle symbol indicates that a computer classroom is needed.
- There is no order of priority for workplace internships (1)(2) · corporate internship (1)(2) · summer internship(1)(2)(3). Students can take electives and obtain credits respectively.
